

Meeting the Needs of Young Families Living and Working in Washington

While Region 12 supports families with children 4 years of age and older, our area is devoid of solutions for residents and employees with infants to 3 years old

The closest options for daily child care are located in New Milford and Litchfield

Washington Family First Initiative

Proposal for Consideration

Make it easier for families with young children to live and work in and around the town of Washington by providing an affordable, full-time, licensed child care solution that serves as a feeder to Region 12 Schools

Is There Enough Demand?

Region 12 Survey of Family with School Aged Children

- Email survey to families with students enrolled in Region 12 Schools
- Conducted in May 2020, prior to enrollment increases driven by the pandemic
- Families from Bridgewater, Roxbury, Washington
- 166 respondents, 77% of surveys completed by female head of household (mom/stepmom)
- 78% of respondents have lived here 6+ years

Relevant Insights Survey of Family with School Aged Children

- Region 12 attracts families with multiple children
 - 80% of respondents raised 2 4 children here
- 47% of respondents enrolled their children in daycare
 - 13% in home day care
 - 34% out-of-home day care
- 40% of respondents indicated day care options were important when comparing one town to another

Relevant Insights Existing Washington After-Care Program

Opened in 2016

- Supports K 5 children on school days and half days
- Averaging 24 children per year
 - 4-5 children per grade






