## **Broadband Committee:**

Chair Hileman reported that he, along with First Selectman Brinton and Highway Department Director, Kevin Smith would be meeting with representatives from Frontier Communications to discuss plans for the installation of fiber optic cable for broadband in Washington.

He added that funding for a Feasibility Study has been approved.

# **CONTINUED DISCUSSION – 2023 PLAN OF CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT:**

# Housing and Demographics:

Chair Hileman stated that the 2022 Affordable Housing Plan would be adopted into the 2023 Plan of Conservation and Development.

He added that the Commission may want to look at the subject of "middle" housing and add some things on the subject.

Demographics are a more complicated issue due to the skewed results of the Census that took place at the time of the pandemic.

The results claim that Washington lost 68 housing units. Land Use records show that 77 housing units were created. Chair Hileman explained that the Census Bureau does this for a reason referred to as "differential privacy" which protects the information filled out on a Census form to protect people's identity.

Information obtained from the Assessor's office will be helpful, but will not go back as far as needed.

None of this will be an issue moving forward, however.

D. Rimsky stated that the Commission may want to take a closer look at how the town is currently being used.

He added that the Zoning Commission, (PA 21-29 Subcommittee), has approached the Historic District regarding allowing affordable housing and multi-family housing in the Historic Districts.

The Commission is looking forward to the Subcommittee's future proposal.
