Textile Bin Comes to Washington

The State of CT has mandated an additional 10% of our Solid Waste Matter (SWM) (garbage) be incorporated in our recycling materials collection. Our Town has answered the call. Many things that we throw away can be recycled. For instance: torn clothing, worn out shoes, ripped doggy beds, old hats, etc.... items not accepted in clothing bins, can now be deposited into textile bins for re-use in manufacturing.

Baystate Textiles has delivered one bin to the Town of Washington. With the help of the Transfer Station staff, our bins will be monitored so as not to create an eyesore from overflow or mis-use.



In addition to the State's mandate, there are also economic reasons for our town to do this. Washington (through our tax dollars) pays for every pound of MSW we throw away. Taking items out of MSW and putting them into recyclables saves our tax dollars. Think how many pounds we all throw away in the form of these textiles (what does an old steel boot, winter coats, etc. weigh?) and what that can add up to!

So friends and neighbors, we're asking you to step up to the plate and throw the appropriate items into the textile bins and help save our tax dollars and our environment.
